As many as 90 to 97 percent of the schools in Port-Au-Prince were destroyed in the recent earthquake in Haiti.

Education officials hope to reopen some schools soon, but with thousands of children and teachers dislocated and as many as 8,000 schools reduced to rubble, it remains unclear how many classrooms can be used, or how many students will return.

To show our support, Project Jericho, in conjunction with UMCOR, will be sewing 400 school bags for children in Haiti.

Here's what we need by March 21, 2010

- 400 blunt scissors (rounded tip)
- 1200 packets of looseleaf 8 1/2" x 11" ruled paper
- 400 30-centimeter rulers
- 400 hand held pencil sharpeners
- 2400 unsharpened pencils with erasers
- 400 erasers, 2 1/2"
- 400 boxes of 24 crayons (only 24)
